Have you played any of these **Escape Room Palm Springs games?**

The Vampire's Lair. A supernatural romance about a witch and a vampire with a very satisfying ending. It's challenging but not impossibly hard.

Titanic. This is especially good for small groups or for first-timers. We recently added a new puzzle that slows people down and adds an extra challenge.

Bank Heist. This is our most popular room and is not a win lose game. Instead, you base your score on how many of the safe deposit box keys you get and thereby collecting loot and avoiding the police.

Jack the Ripper is the ultimate challenge for experienced players. It'll test your skills with advanced puzzles, some complex clues, and a theme based on the world's first notorious serial killer.

Merlin's Magic School is a fun game for small groups like three to five people. It's a linear room meaning that it goes from puzzle a to puzzle B to puzzle C, etc. Everyone will work together on every puzzle.

Atau stands for a traitor among Us. It was inspired by the online game among Us which became very popular during the pandemic. It's a player versus player game where your ability to lie will help you win the game. There are a lot of blocks and denials and lots of false accusations. You go in as a group and one or more of you is a traitor trying to sabotage the spaceship in every round. You play multiple rounds and someone different
